Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to term two. This is always one of our busiest and exciting terms, as we start with our firework extravaganza this week and move on to our Christmas celebrations.

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## Charity

Once again our hard-working, compassionate children gave up their time to sell cakes, bookmarks and other goodies to raise money for Mollie's Miracle – for research into AT. They raised £80.25 and we are very proud of them.

We also held the 'Wear it Pink' day on the last day of term, Tuesday 22nd October, to raise money for breast cancer, and we are delighted to say that our families generously donated the sum of £453.28 to this important charity. It was lovely to see so many of our children and staff getting involved.











Our next planned charity is linked to Children in Need, which falls on Friday 15th November, and children will be able to make a small donation to this charity on that day. In addition to this, a group of year 4 children (Marnie, Aubree, Jessica and Ava) will be selling small items that same week (11th to 14th November) in aid of Children in Need.

The October discos were a great success, and the children embraced the opportunities to dance with their friends and to have fun. A big thank you to all the volunteers who helped make the events such a success.



The next PTA event is our wonderful bedtime stories evening, on November 22nd, when our youngest children in EYFS get to come back to school in their pyjamas and with their teddies, have flavoured milk and cookies, and snuggle up to have stories read to them by school staff.

We will very soon be receiving our book vending machine, which is fully funded by the PTA. This will take pride of place in our reception area and will be a great incentive for children to read more. The PTA have also agreed to fund a sensory trail, some additional sports kit and the EYFS/KS1 pantomime.

### **Diversity**

We were all very excited and a little bit starstruck to welcome Dr Ranj to school. He agreed to read one of his books to the children up to and including Year 3. He is known for presenting on a number of television shows, including 'Get Well Soon' on CBeebies. He has also written some children's books which celebrate diversity. He shared his book, A Super Hero Like You, with the children, and signed a few of his other books for the school.







We all wore red on Friday, 18th October to participate in 'Show Racism the Red Card' day. It was lovely to see so many of our children take part in this important anti-racism event, and reminds us all of how important it is to be upstanders and not bystanders.





#### **Safeguarding**

As a whole school, we have been working to promote the NSPCC's message of 'speak out and stay safe'. The children all took part in an assembly on this theme where they heard about the ways in which children could be hurt by others, that it is never a child's fault, and all children have the right to be kept safe. The children spoke about who to talk to if they, or a friend needs help. We are encouraging the children to remember this message by looking out for 'Buddy', a cartoon character, who pops up around the school reminding them to speak out whenever they are worried.
