


Our next group of children to fundraise are raising funds for Battersea Dog and Cat Rescue and will be selling their wares from March 25th.



MedwayGo Activities for the Easter Holiday

MedwayGo provides holiday activities and food for school aged children. It is free for children that are eligible for benefit related free school meals and there is some funding for children classed as vulnerable, for example children with SEND, looked after children and military families. If your child is not eligible for a free place, you can access paid places. Eligible children will be able to book and attend 4 activities across the Easter programme. Whilst enjoying physical and enrichment activities, children will also receive a hot healthy meal. There are a range of activities on offer from sports, theatre workshops, outdoor pursuits, music and more.
